We also enjoyed learning about number lines.

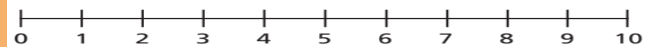

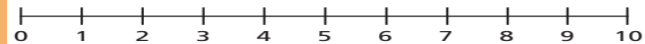
