Expanded Noun Phrase
An expanded noun phrase is a phrase made up of a noun and at least one adjective. If you list more than one adjective to describe the noun, you should add a comma to separate them.

lots of yummy, cold ice cream

Determiner <small>Used to introduce a noun to specify which one or how many: a/an, the, three, most.</small>	Adjective <small>A word that describes a noun: monstrous, vivid, delightful, familiar.</small>	Noun <small>A person, object or animal: garage, Henry, leopard, sofa.</small>
