Focus Texts: Cave Baby by Julia Donaldson and Emily Gravett; Sidney, Stella and the Moon by Emma Yarlett; Send for a Superhero by Michael Rosen and Katherine McEwan and I want my hat back by Jon Klassen Reading: Reading is practised daily in our phonics sessions and throughout the day. We love reading in 1R! We have a daily story time and children are encouraged to read in the class book corner. We also have weekly visits to the school library.

Writing:Our writing is linked to our focus texts. This term we will be

Maths: This term we will be learning about:

Number: Place Value (within 10) Number: Addition and subtraction

Geometry (shape)

Number: Place value (within 20)

Science: Use of everyday materials

We will identify and compare a range of materials including glass, metal, plastic, paper, rock and wood. We will be exploring the properties of these materials and classifying objects based on their properties. We will also be testing the properties of a range of objects.

Autumn Term Curriculum

Computing: Computing systems and networks Information technology around us, identifying IT and how its responsible use improves our world in school and beyond.

Creating media - Digital photography, capturing and changing digital photographs for different purposes.

History/Geography:

River Beck: For two weeks children will be learning information about the River Beck and creating pieces of art based around the river.

Seasons: Children will be learning the four seasons and the types of weather associated with each season.

Civilisation - destruction and transformation: We will be learning about the history of toys

PE:

Games - we will be developing our gross motor skills and cooperational skills through fundamental movement and invasion based games.

Dance - exploring movement ideas and responding imaginatively to a range of stimuli. Art/DT:Mechanisms:Sliders and Levers
