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English:

Focus Texts: *The Journey Home* by Frann Preston-Gannon, *The Owl and the Pussy-Cat* by Edward Lear and Charlotte, *The Great Fire of London* by Emma Adams and James

Reading: We read our class books every day in class and have a class book corner. We visit the library and take books home to enjoy at home.

Writing: Our writing is linked to our focus texts. This term we will be writing posters, lists, postcards, information reports, short stories and poems.

Maths: This term we will be learning about: Numbers 0-100 and their Place Value, Addition and subtraction, Measurement: Money, Multiplication and Division - 2, 5 10 - times tables, Fractions and Statistics, Property of Shapes.

Autumn Term Curriculum

Science:

Our topic is: uses of everyday materials- We will identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses and we will find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching

History/Geography:

Civilisation - destruction and transformation

Events beyond living memory that are significant nationally or globally- The Great Fire of London

River Thames - we will use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features; devise a simple map; and use and construct basic symbols in a key.

PE: Games - we will be developing our gross motor skills and cooperational skills through fundamental movement and invasion based games.

Modern Foreign Language (Spanish):

Harvest time - we will learn autumn colours and basic fruits and vegetables. **Superheroes** - learn greetings, colours, numbers and commands. **Body parts** - learn the words for different body parts.

Art/DT:

Painting- Spotlight on the artist inspired by water: Claude Monet (Thames paintings) **Collage** - Spotlight on the art inspired by Great Fire of London. **Mechanism** - We will explore and use winding mechanisms. We will begin to incorporate wheels and axles into our products

Music:

MX Sing
The Tempest - performance project.

Computing: Computing systems and networks -

Information technology around us, identifying IT and how its responsible use improves our world in school and beyond.

Creating media - Digital photography, capturing and changing digital photographs for different purposes.

PSHE:

Being me in my world - we will discuss our hopes and fears for the year, rights and responsibilities, rewards and consequences.

Celebrating differences - we will discuss assumptions and stereotypes about gender, gender differences, bullying and celebrating diversity.

RE:

Leaders and Teachers - learning about different roles of religious leaders and their characteristics
Christmas Celebrations - we will be learning about how Christmas is celebrated all around the world and comparing it to our family traditions and celebrations.
