Focus Texts: Varmints by Helen Ward, Shackleton's Journey by W'm Grill, FARThER by Grahame Baker, Until I Met Dudley by Roger McGough and Winter's Child by Angela McAllister

Reading: Our class author is Roald Dahl

Writing: Descriptive comparisons, retellings, setting descriptions, poetry

Maths: Place value to 10,000, addition & subtraction, measurement: time, multiplication and division. Ensuring times tables are being learnt from 1 - 12.

Science: Living things and their habitats, classification, identifying & naming living things in the local & wider environment, environmental change & threats to wildlife

Autumn Term Curriculum

Computing: Systems & networks - the Internet, recognising networks including the www, and evaluating online content. Audio editing: producing a podcast and considering copyright.
