English Focus Texts: Cinnamon by Neil Gaiman, The Matchbox Diary by Paul Fleischman, Weslandia by Paul Fleischman and Kevin Hawkes, Odd and the Frost Giants by Neil Gaiman and Chris Riddell

Reading: We read our class novel daily and have a class book corner. **Writing:** Writing in linked to our focus texts: diary entries, informal letters, dialogue, adverts, limericks and other poetry forms. **Maths:** time, multiplication and division, fractions and decimals. Ensuring times tables are being learnt from 1 - 12.

Science: States of Matter; classifying and sorting materials to whether they are solids, liquids or gas. Observing how materials change states when heated or cooled. Identify the different parts of the water cycle.

Spring Term Curriculum

Computing: Programming: Repetition in shapes Using a text-based programming language to explore count-controlled loops when drawing shapes Data information: Data logging Recognising how and why data is collected over time, before using data loggers to carry out an investigation.

History: Civilisation - destruction & transformation: The Viking and Anglo-Saxon struggle for the Kingdom of England to the time of Edward the Confessor Modern Foreign Language (Spanish): Learn about important facts about the epiphany in Spain. Say family words. Read, say and understand nouns for parts of the face.

PSHE: Dreams and goals; setting achievable goals, overcoming disappointment, building resilience and celebrating others. Healthy me; creating healthy friendships and lifestyle.

PE: PE: Basketball & handball (indoor). Football & cricket (outdoor).

Art: Photography (1 week) - Art & Science: Spotlight on the artist: Underwater photographer of the year (change annually) Printing (6 weeks): Spotlight on the Art: Indonesian batik. Red sunset over a volcano DT: cooking (baking bread)
