Reading: We read our class books every day in class and have a class book corner. We visit the library and take books home to enjoy at home.

Writing: Our writing is linked to our focus texts. This term we will be writing posters, nostcards, information reports, short stories and noems

Maths: This term we will be learning about: Numbers 0-100 and their Place Value, Addition and subtraction, Measurement: Money, Multiplication and Division - 2, 5 10 - times tables, Fractions and Statistics, Property of Shapes.

Science:

Our topic is: Uses of everyday materials. We will identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and

Computing: Computing systems and networks - Information technology around us, identifying IT and how its responsible use improves our world in school and beyond.

Creating media - Digital photography, capturing and changing digital photographs for different purposes

History/Geography:

Civilisation - destruction and transformation
