To support our youngest learners with building up a love for reading we allow all Nursery children to select their own reading books. Literacy

Spring 1 'Telling a Tale'

We will be reading 'The Gingerbread Man' by Miriam Latimer and Mara Alperin and 'Handa's Surprise' by Eileen Browne

Spring 2- 'Sowing a Seed'

We will be reading 'Jack and the beanstalk' by Mara Alperin and Mark Chambers and 'The Gigantic Turnip' by Aleksei Tolstoy.

We will continue to support mark making daily and will be practising with the children how to write their names on to their work. In phonics we will continue learning about rhyming words and begin learning about alliteration and how to orally segment and blend words.

Maths

- We will continue practising how to count up to and down from 10 reliably.
- We will be exploring ways in which we can represent numbers including on our fingers, with marks on paper, sand and different mediums along various other methods.
- We will be exploring both 2D and 3D shapes and looking at the similarity of shapes with objects in our environment.
- We will be learning how to work out what is one more and one less than a given number.
- We will be exploring different ways to take and compare measurements.

Spring Term Curriculum

Understanding The World

Spring 1 will focus on looking at the similarities and differences between us, including looking at different cultures, interests and languages spoken.

Spring 2 will be all about growing seeds, looking after them and finding out about different fruits, herbs and vegetables.

Physical development

We will be exploring our physical development through yoga, dance and various exercise videos in class. Also honing our listening and attention skills and working on our ability to follow instructions.

Outside we will be developing our gross motor skills and and cooperational skills through catching and tagging games, parachute games and practising our throwing and catching.

Expressive Arts and Design

We will be exploring our movement through dance and ring games. We will be making our own gingerbread men using salt dough. We will be exploring traditional Kenyan music linked to our story Handa's surprise. We will be engaging in role play, acting out our favourite parts of our stories. We will also be doing some group projects linked to our stories: making a large 3D model of a beanstalk, creating a paper mache gigantic turnip and using it to record a short film of the story.
