Autumn Term Curriculum



Literacy

Focus Texts: **Owl Babies by Martin Waddell and Anansi the Spider Gerald McDermott**

Reading: We will be repeating words and phrases from familiar stories. We will be filling in the missing word or phrase in a known story or nursery rhyme. We read our class books every day and have a reading corner in the classroom. We also sing nursery rhymes daily linking this to counting and rhyming.

Writing: Our writing is linked to our focus texts. This term we will orally retell the story and draw pictures of our favourite parts of the story. Children are also encouraged to engage in mark making of their own choosing, experiment with different writing tools and writing onto different media.

Maths: This term we will be learning about -

Counting up to 10 using nursery rhymes.

Using positional language.

Exploring repeating patterns using different colours and shapes.

Learning about shapes in our environment.

Expressive Arts and Design

We will be making our own owl babies.

We will make mummy owl using natural materials. We will make spider webs and stringy spider web slime. We will explore colours and colour mixing. We be making spider hats and experimenting with wax and water colours.

Autumn Term Curriculum

Understanding The World: Inside Outside

We will be exploring things we can find in the woods and looking at different natural materials and wildlife that lives there. We will look at changes in the seasons going from summer to autumn. We will be identifying and exploring our feelings through talking about how the owl babies feel in our story. We will be learning about Ghana, linked with our story Anansi the spider and talking about the different places we are all from. We will be investigating the similarities and differences between different minibeasts.

PE: Games - We will be developing our gross motor skills and cooperational skills through fundamental movement and invasion based games.

Phonics: In phonics this term we will be focusing on really honing in our listening and attention skills. We will be identifying everyday sounds, exploring instruments and the different types of sounds we can make, learning about body percussion and experimenting with rhythm and rhyme.

School Dinners and Packed Lunch - Nursery



We encourage all children to take school meals so that they have a well balanced meal during the day.

The children should only bring water to school to drink in a reusable water bottle.



We are a nut free school

Please **do not** put the following in your child's packed lunch:

- Crisps
- Chocolate
- Biscuits
- Fizzy drinks
- Juice

If you think you may be eligible for free school meals, please see our school office.



Spare Clothing and Uniform

- All school uniform should be clearly labelled with your child's name, this includes their coat and bag.
- All children should have a spare clothing bag that contains:
 - At least 2 complete spare sets of clothing - tops, trousers, underwear, socks, and one jumper or cardigan.
 - Spare shoes
 - Plastic bags or nappy bags for dirty/ wet clothing.
 - Wet wipes or toilet wipes.

The spare clothes bag can remain on their peg unless there is clothing inside that needs to be replaced. Spare clothing does not need to be school uniform but should be clearly labelled with your child's name.

- All children should come in with a water bottle also clearly labelled with their name.
- If you would like your child to start taking reading books home please send them in with a book bag or additional bag (separate to their spare clothes bag) that they can take home daily. Any work done during the day ready to go home will also be placed in here.

Cooking




We are going to start cooking sessions with the children after half term. Cooking from a young age is a great way to introduce the children to new tastes and foods.

In order to provide enough for all of the children to participate we will ask for small contributions from parents to cover the cost of the ingredients required - approximately £1.

Cooking will be every other week (3 times each short term).

A notice will be placed on the classroom door informing you of which recipe we will be making that week.

We welcome parent participation and input. If you have any simple recipes you enjoy making with your child at home please feel free to share them with us so we can try them out in class.

Attendance and Punctuality



Children start school at 8:55. Gates are open from 8:45 and children begin learning straight away. While the children are still settling in they will free flow for the first 15 minutes of the day. The bell will then be rung at 9 to begin the register and the morning carpet session.

Children must be on time every day so that they are ready for learning and so that they do not disturb the learning of other children.

If your child's attendance drops below 90% or they are frequently late, our attendance team will contact you to offer support.

Healthy snacks only at the end of the day and please do not use your phone in the playground - this is a safeguarding issue.

Absence



If your child is unable to come to school due to illness, you must call the school number and speak to the office or leave a message before the start of the school day.

If we do not receive information about why your child is absent we will call you. If attendance issues are ongoing we may conduct a home visit.

Please try to book appointments outside of the school day but if this is not possible, bring any appointment cards/letters/texts to the office.

We are unable to authorise any term time holidays.

School finishes at 3:15



Please be on time to collect your child. It can be distressing for children to be the only ones left.

If you are going to be late it is **very important** that you call to let us know so we can reassure your child that you are on your way.

Children who are collected after 3:40 will be put in after school club at a cost to you.
