# Autumn Term Curriculum



## Literacy

Focus Texts: **Where The Wild Things Are** by Maurice Sendak and **Bringing The Rain to Kapiti plain** by Verma Ardema

Reading: **Identifying and pronouncing phonemes**

**s,a,t,p,i,n,m,d,g,o,c**

We read our class books every day and have a reading corner in the classroom.

Writing: Our writing is linked to our focus texts. This term we will orally retell the story and make a story map. We will draw and write about the story. We will say what we would do if we were Max. We will create mini books based on the story.

## Maths:

We will learn how to count reliably up to 20 and back down to zero.

We will be looking at the properties of numbers 0-10. We will be practising writing numerals 0 – 9 with correct formation

## Understanding The World: Inside Outside

We will be exploring the weather including how to dress for different types of weather.

We will be exploring ice and melting. We will be exploring feelings through the character of Max, linking to their own feelings. We will make boats to float outside. We will mix cereal and liquid to explore similarities and differences between different materials.

## Autumn Term Curriculum

**PE: Games** - We will be developing our gross motor skills and cooperational skills through fundamental movement and invasion based games.

## Expressive Arts and Design

We will be making paper-plate masks and kitchen tube models of monsters. We will be making boats that float and monster biscuits.

We will be creating a 'Wild things' dance.

We will be composing a song and dance using shakers and rattlers.

We will be colour-mixing to make green, yellow, blue and brown.

The children should only bring water to school to drink in a reusable water bottle.

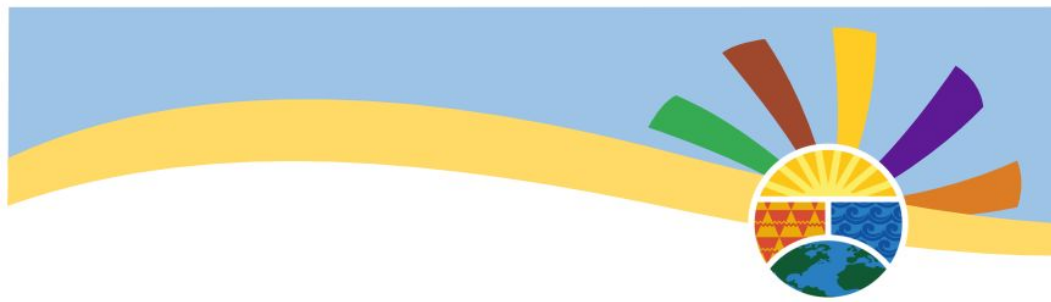


## We are a nut free school

## Attendance and Punctuality

Children start school at 8:55. Gates are open from 8:45 and children begin learning straight away.

Children must be on time every day so that they are ready for learning and so that they do not disturb the learning of other children.

If your child's attendance drops below 90% or they are frequently late, our attendance team will contact you to offer support.

Healthy snacks only at the end of the day and please do not use your phone in the playground - this is a safeguarding issue.

# Absence



If your child is unable to come to school due to illness, you must call the school number and speak to the office or leave a message before the start of the school day.

If we do not receive information about why your child is absent we will call you. If attendance issues are ongoing we may conduct a home visit.

Please try to book appointments outside of the school day but if this is not possible, bring any appointment cards/letters/texts to the office.

# School finishes at 3:15



Please be on time to collect your child. It can be distressing for children to be the only ones left.

If you are going to be late it is **very important** that you call to let us know so we can reassure your child that you are on your way.

Children who are collected after 3:40 will be put in after school club at a cost to you.
