We do not have scheduled PE lessons but will engage in regular yoga, exercise and dance in class. Spring 1 'Telling a Tale'

We will be reading 'Handa's Surprise' by Eileen Browne and 'The Gingerbread Man'' by Miriam Latimer and Mara Alperin.

Spring 2- 'Sowing a Seed'

We will be reading 'Jack and the beanstalk' by Mara Alperin and Mark Chambers and The Gigantic Turnip' by Aleksei Tolstoy.

Understanding The World:

Spring 1 will focus on looking at the similarities and differences between us, including looking at different cultures, interests and languages spoken.

Spring 2 will be all about growing seeds, looking after them and finding out about different fruits, herbs and vegetables. We will also be hatching some chicks in class. Learning how to take care of them at each stage and understanding more about their changes over time

Maths:

We will continue practising counting independently up to 10 and recognising numerals 0-10.

We will be exploring ways in which we can represent numbers including on our fingers, with marks on paper, sand and different mediums along various other methods. We will be exploring both 2D and 3D shapes and looking at the similarity of shapes with objects in our environment. We will be learning how to work out what is one more and one less than a given number.

Spring Term Curriculum

Phonics: In phonics this term we will be practising a variety of familiar nursery rhymes, songs and games incorporating rhyming and alliteration. We will be continuing on with learning the letter sounds and practising how to orally segment and blend short cvc words.

Expressive Arts and Design

We will be exploring our movement through dance and ring games.
We will be making our own gingerbread men using salt dough.
We will be exploring traditional Kenyan music linked to our story Handa's surprise.
We will be engaging in role play, acting out our favourite parts of our stories.
