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Cycle Confident Training



It was great to see the children's confidence and skill improving over Thursday and Friday! They really worked hard and showed resilience, overcoming their fears and learning from setbacks. Well done!

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Netball Competition

On Thursday, Ms Greta took a team of Y5 children to the netball competition at Kennington Park. The children played really well and were matched against secondary schools. They didn't win any of their matches but they told me about how well they played and how hard they worked as a team!



Eco Warriors

As you may know, Ms Gentleman now leads the Eco Warriors. She is working on a range of projects with the children and has split them into groups. Here is an update:

This term, the eco team has completed an environmental review, this will support our application for the Green Flag award at the end of the year. The environmental review asked the children to consider the categories of biodiversity, energy, global citizenship, healthy living, litter, marine, school grounds, transport, waste and water. This review enabled the children to establish the eco topics that will be our focus this year - biodiversity and waste.

They have also worked with Robyn from 'Dirt is Good'. The 'Dirt is Good' school programme enables children to take action on the environmental and social causes that they care about. Robyn facilitated a workshop with the eco team, where they considered their shared values and decided on the projects that they thought were important. We have tried to tie these projects with our eco topics. The eco team (22 in total) have now been organised into groups. These groups have the responsibility of organising different projects throughout the term including:

- a big clothes swap (parents will be invited to bring in old clothes and we will hold a clothes swap event,
- the big plastic count (whereby the whole school will be involved with recording the plastic waste that they throw away each day during a week)
- a recycling collection (whereby children will ensure that recycling is collected and distributed to a shared area in school in order for the waste to be disposed of correctly).

Within each group, the children will have different areas of responsibility including; project manager, researcher, communicator, presenter, reporter and reflector. We are also excited to have been awarded a £2000 grant from Lambeth Future Fit schools to develop the nature garden in the EYFS area. The eco team will be involved with considering how we can encourage biodiversity in this area.

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School Council

Ms Trewhella now leads the School Council and they have been hard at work!

The school council has been working on developments in the playground and how we can make the best use of the space we have. Children have voted for a quiet space which has been agreed to be the bus. At the moment they are collecting ideas for what children want in the bus. They also collected ideas from the children for Craze of the Week which will begin when we have purchased a dedicated set of equipment for this purpose.

The school council collected ideas for what children would like as their reward for the class with the best attendance. The school voted for looking after the guinea pigs. The school council have now completed their training and they will be able to help their class with looking after them when their class wins the weekly attendance reward.

The school council has been giving out books from the book trollies at the end of the day on the Sunnyhill road and Harborough road gate.

Other Pupil Leadership Opportunities

We try to offer opportunities to as many children as possible to help increase their confidence and develop their leadership skills.

Reading buddies

Year 5 have been going to read with reception daily from 1-1:30. There is a rota for this and two children go each day. There has been good feedback from the teachers so far.

Lunchtime monitors

Year 4 have a rota where they help reception/yr1 and 2 in the hall. Their duties include:

- Help reception and year 1 and 2 find somewhere to sit, get water and cut their food up
- Help the smaller children to clear their plates when they have finished
- Encourage the children to eat all of their food, especially their vegetables
- Serve children on the salad bar
- Top up the knives, forks and spoons

Translators

Pupils who speak more than one language have been offered the opportunity to be translators for other pupils. Those who have volunteered, will have their picture and the language they can translate on the door of their classroom. They will be asked to translate for new children about the routines of the day and the values. They may be asked to show visitors around the school who cannot speak English.
