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English:

Focus Texts: Ocean meets Sky by The Fan Brothers, Jim and the Beanstalk by Raymond Briggs, House Held Up by Trees by Ted Kooser and Jon Klassen and The Minpins by Roald Dahl and Patrick Benson. We will also study a book for Refugee Week.

Reading: We read our class books every day in class and have a class book corner. We visit the library and take books home to enjoy at home.

Writing: Our writing is linked to our focus texts. This term we will be writing postcards, a sequel and creating our own magical story

Maths: This term we will be learning about: Fractions- whole, half, thirds, quarters, unit and non-unit fractions. Time -half past, 5 minutes, quarter past, quarter to,minutes in an hour, hours in a day. Statistics- pictograms. Position and direction-turns, movements and patterns.

Science: Our topic is: Plants

Spring Term Curriculum

History/Geography:

Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to: key physical features, including: beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season and weather.
