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English

<u>Focus texts:</u> The Pied Piper of Hamelin by Michael Morpurgo, *Escape from Pompeii* by Christina Balit, *Jim: A Cautionary Tale* by Hilaire Belloc & Mini Grey, *The Day I Swapped My Dad For Two Goldfish* by Neil Gaiman and Dave McKean.

<u>Reading:</u> We use a variety of texts and specifically focus on fluency, expanding vocabulary, interpreting characters and inference questions.

<u>Writing:</u> We will be writing different text types such as: a mystery narrative, a newspaper report, a narrative poem and diary entries. Throughout the term we will teach a range of

Science

Our topics is forces. We will investigate how objects move on different surfaces. We will classify materials according to whether or not they are magnetic. We will explore how magnets behave in relation to each other and design an investigation to test the strength of magnets.

History and Geography

Our History topic is The Roman Empire and its impact on Britain and London. We will study Roman civilization and culture and look for examples in Britain and London. In Geography we will describe and understand key aspects of physical geography, including: mountains, volcanoes and earthquakes.

PE

We will build hand-eye coordination in handball and athletics. We will continue to work on teamwork skills and get ready for Sports Day. We will improve our fitness throughout and enjoy some rounders games.

Maths

This term we continue with fractions, including fractions of numbers. We will move on to time; telling the time to the minute, measuring time in seconds and using the 24 hour clock. We will move on to properties of 2D and 3D shapes and finish off with mass and capacity. We will continue to practise our 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables.

Spring Term Curriculum

Modern Foreign Language (Spanish)

In Spanish we will be learning how to talk about fruit, vegetables and breakfast foods, to ask and answer simple questions about where we live and to enjoy a story in Spanish.

Art and DT

We will experiment with complementary colours and bold painting techniques to create a piece of Pop Art. We will study the work of Yinka Shonibare and explore textiles to create a finished piece of artwork.

Music

MX Play - recorders and singing

We will continue to learn to the play the recorder building on the three notes we have learnt so far. We will team this with drumming to create class performances.

Computing

We will be learning about programming through Scratch. We will programme our sprites to move in sequence, respond to commands and make sound. We will finish the project by programming a musical instrument.
